PRAY, SACRIFICE, INVITE

A recent Pew Forum study found that 50 percent of Catholics didn't know the church's teaching on the Real Presence. 63 percent of Catholics personally believe that the bread and wine literally become the body and blood of Christ at the consecration--including 17 percent who had no idea that the church actually teaches that this is true.

As parish coordinator, one thing you can do is to have some books available about the Eucharist in the Adoration Chapel. One good book is <u>The Eucharistic Miracles of the World</u>. The book is published by Eternal Life and it includes all of the Vatican approved Eucharistic Miracles around the world. It also covers the saints and mystics of the Eucharistic and stories about the Blessed Mother related to the Eucharistic and miraculous communions.

The miracles are organized by country and include colorful photos. Many of the miracles occurred to sustain the weak faith of someone who did not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Pray to one of the saints devoted to the Eucharistic. 25. In order to enhance security, may the Blessed Sacrament be exposed behind a glass window?

No. The Blessed Sacrament may be exposed in either a monstrance or ciborium and is usually placed on the altar for adoration. The exposition of the Blessed Sacrament behind a glass a window is not the "exposition" envisioned by the rite. Such arrangements often result in the appearance of a "glass Tabernacle," which is forbidden.
