Historical Note

Brief Chronology of the Life of Bishop William DuBourg

- 1766 February 14 Born on Isle de Saint-Domingue, a French colony in the Carribean, to merchant Pierre DuBourg and Marguerite Armand de Vogluzan
- 1768 Went to France to live with grandparents and be educated at the College de Guyenne
- 1786 October 12 Entered Seminary of Saint-Sulpice in Paris
- 1788 Director of a preparatory seminary in Issy near Paris
- 1790 March 20 Ordained to priesthood
- 1792 Fled France to Spain during the *Reign of Terror*
- 1794 Sailed to the United States arriving in Baltimore, Maryland
- 1795 March 9 Joined Sulpician Community in Baltimore
- 179 -1798 President of Georgetown College
- 1799 Attempted to establish a French school in Havana, Cuba
- 1799 Established St. Mary's College in Baltimore
- 1812 August 18 Appointed Apostolic Administrator of Louisiana and the Floridas
- 1812 December Arrived in New Orleans
- 1815 Traveled to Europe to recruit clergy and raise funds for the Diocese
- 1815 September 24 Consecrated Bishop of Louisiana and Floridas in Rome by Cardinal Dorica Pamphilia in the Church of St. Louis des Français in Rome
- 1817 Arrived back in the United States
- 1818 January 6 Installed as Bishop of St. Louis
- 1823 July 14 Joseph Rosati appointed DuBourg's Co-Adjutor of the Diocese
- 1826 Resigned and returned to France, resignation officially granted on July 8

1826 Appointed Bishop of Montauban, France

1833 February Appointed Archbishop of Besançon

1833 December 12 Died in Besançon and buried in the Besançon Cathedral

Scope and Content

The collection consists of original correspondence between DuBourg and others dating from 1814-1833. Materials are in English, Latin, Italian, Spanish and French. French and English predominate. Following the basic inventory of this finding aid, the appendix contains an item-level inventory with dates, correspondents and a brief description or list of key words of content.

A significant portion of the collection is from Reverend Charles Souvay's Collection, which is comprised of photocopies and transcriptions of correspondence between DuBourg and others. Father Souvay was a priest in the Archdiocese of St. Louis in the 1900s-1930s. The Souvay Collection can also be found on microfilm in the Archives.
