

# ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL SCHOLARSHIP ESSAY CONTEST REQUIREMENTS

Each year, the *Annual Catholic Appeal* (ACA) brings Catholics throughout the Archdiocese of St. Louis together to share God's love with those who seek it, both giving and receiving His bountiful blessings. In an effort to share the good news about the *Appeal's* impact in our community and to promote the involvement of our young people in the life of the local Church, Archbishop Mitchell T. Rozanski and the ACA Council invite high school juniors who attend a Catholic high school in the Archdiocese of St. Louis to participate in the contest. Scholarships are awarded for the student's senior year with \$1,000 for first place, \$750 for second, and \$500 for third.

## **ESSAY OBJECTIVES**

Faculty at participating schools will judge essays according to the manner in which the participant addresses the following questions:

- Why is it important for me, and all Catholics in the Archdiocese of St. Louis, to come together to participate in the *Annual Catholic Appeal*?
- What does "Stewardship" mean to me, and how do I practice it in my life?
- How are people in my community and/or throughout the Archdiocese impacted by the ACA?

Essays should be limited to 3-5 typed and double-spaced pages. The heading on the first page of the essay must list the following: student name and title (e.g., Mr. or Miss), name of school, home address, city, state, zip, phone number, email address, and parish (if applicable).

### **SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

The faculty at participating schools are responsible for reviewing the essays; selecting the top three; and ranking them in the order of first, second and third place.

The school is asked to submit the top three essays ELECTRONICALLY (PDF preferred) to Laura Fisher at <a href="mailto:laurafisher@archstl.org">laurafisher@archstl.org</a> no later than October 6, 2023. Only essays submitted by the deadline and meeting all contest requirements are eligible for scholarships.

A letter from Archbishop Rozanski will be mailed to the winners from each school, notifying them of their scholarship and inviting them to an award ceremony and photo session. Member of the school administration and faculty are also welcome to attend.

## **AWARD CEREMONY**

Archbishop Rozanski will present award certificates at a ceremony and photo session on **Tuesday**, **December 5, 2023**. Scholarships are awarded for the student's senior year and funds will be sent directly to the school in July 2024.

- Award ceremony and photo session will take place in the Fleur de Lis Room of the <u>Cardinal Rigali</u> Center on Tuesday, December 5, 2023, at 3:30 PM.
- At this event, students will receive an Award Certificate and take part in a photo session with Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski. Students should plan to wear their school uniform or other appropriate attire.
- A group photo of the essay winners with Archbishop Rozanski is published in the *St. Louis Review*. Students' parent/guardian must sign a Media Authorization Release Form prior to the event.
