Incarnate Word Academy, founded in 1932 as an all-girls Catholic high school, located Bel Nor, a north-county suburb. The college preparatory program provides personal attention to students, preparing them to become self-assured, knowledgeable women who go on to make positive impacts on their community.

Incarnate Word Foundation, founded in 1997 after the sale of Incarnate Word Hospital. Its mission is to provide funding for religious, charitable and educational purposes and to offer programming related to the significant justice and equity issues of today.

St. Elizabeth Adult Day Care Center, founded in 1981 by the Sisters of the Most Precious Blood, O'Fallon. The Sisters of Charity of the Incarnate Word assumed sponsorship in 2018. The ministry provides a safe, comfortable, wholesome and stimulating environment in six locations for the aged and persons with special needs.

The Sisters also sponsor El Puente Hispanic Ministry in the neighboring Diocese of Jefferson City, MO.
