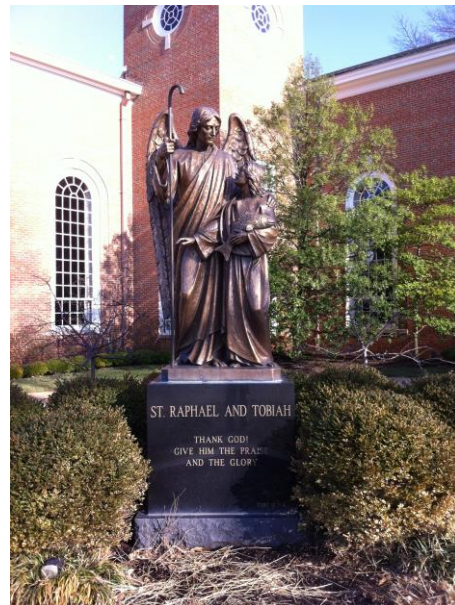

## Stewardship: Gift of the Present Moment

Hello Friend,

When I was working in the business world, my job required constant planning for things that were always six months to one year away. Most of the time I was thinking about the future. Unfortunately, this spilled into my personal life, always looking down the road, making plans, not really living in the here and now. I think this happens to a lot of us. I suppose this is what leads to a lot of our unhappiness. We get "locked in" to the future and when those things don't turn out as we planned, we are disappointed or frustrated. We are always looking for the next thing to make us happy. We think that God isn't listening to our prayers.

As I think about it now, my life was out of balance – too much time in the future and not enough time in the present. Too dependent on my own self-reliance and not enough trust in God and His plan for me. God still wants us to plan, but He wants us to spend more time living day to day. Living in His presence, checking in with Him throughout our daily activities. Living in our current circumstances, not waiting until we make ourselves "better" or when "I'm ready. As a matter of fact, we ask this God every day when we pray the "Our Father" – "...give us this day our daily bread..." (this means more than just food).



We weren't designed to be apart from God. We are made in His image and likeness. We were made to be in constant contact with the Holy Trinity throughout our day. A joy-filled life without God is unsustainable. We all know there are no guarantees that tomorrow will come. But do we actually believe and live our lives like every day is a gift?

This has led me to the gift of the Present Moment. In the present moment I...

- Enjoy more of the "small" wonders of life; many things that I used to take for granted.
- Maybe do nothing at all, just "be" in the presence of God, family and friends.
- Actively listen to God and others, putting their needs ahead of mine.
- See Jesus in the current moment, in the faces of others and in my interactions with others.
- Know that God loves me in my current condition.
- Am more open and flexible to God's plan for me.

When I make time for God each day, things that used to be important to me are no longer important. Things that need to get done, get done. God seems to bend time and helps me accomplish more. When you invite the Holy Spirit into your life, He shows up!

In **Sarah Young's** daily devotional "**Jesus Calling**", she says the following about the present moment. "Accept each day as it comes and find Jesus in the midst of it all. A successful day is when we stay in touch with Jesus throughout the day and don't let your "to do" list become an idol directing your life."

### Everyday Stewardship – Tracy Welliver (Liturgical Publications, Inc.)

- Thank you **Mr. Tracy Welliver** for a wonderful presentation on "Everyday Stewardship" on March 19 – 21 and to all attendees and host parish sites.
- Here is a quick summary of the six stewardship parables Tracy discussed:
  - [Parables of the Talents](#) – nurture and develop our gifts to give back with increase; don't bury your talents.
  - [Parable of the Widow's Mite](#) – she gave all she had, not just from her excess. What prevents you from sacrificing?
  - [Parable of the Sower](#) – planting seeds in rich soil is similar to each of us using our gifts where God is calling us; discern how God is calling you.
  - [Parable of the Mustard Seed](#) – no gift is too small; God does big things with "small" gifts; we can do small things that make a big impact.
  - [Parable of the Pearl of Great Price](#) – what are you willing to do to gain Heaven? Sharing. Service, Sowing, Surrender.
  - [Parable of the Good Samaritan](#) – it's not just "extraordinary" talents that matter, ordinary talents are equally important; he used all his gifts – time, talent and treasure.

## Roman Catholic Foundation – Donor-Advised Funds

- **The Foundation's Catholic DAFs are aligned with our faith.**
  - Investments are screened for Catholic moral values according to USCCB guidelines.
  - Recommended grantees are reviewed to ensure they do not operate in opposition to the teachings of the Catholic Church.
- **DAFs simplify charitable giving.**
  - Donors avoid writing checks to multiple charities; the Foundation sends checks based on donors' grant recommendations.
  - By consolidating charitable giving through a DAF, donors receive just one tax receipt per year regardless of the number of charities they support, simplifying the tax process.
- **DAFs offer tax advantages.**
  - Capital gains taxes can be reduced or eliminated when a DAF is established with highly appreciated assets.
  - Donors can offset years of high income by contributing to a DAF to receive a charitable deduction.
  - DAFs are invested and grow tax-free, allowing donors to give more.
- **A Catholic DAF can help create a family legacy of giving.**

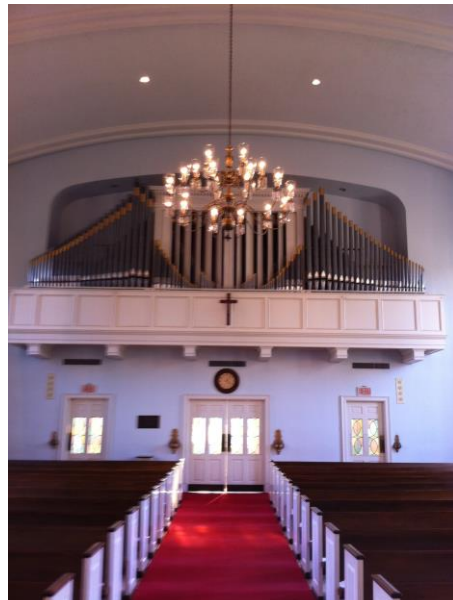
