Three Virtues of an Ideal Team Player

- 1) <u>Humble</u>
 - The single greatest and most indispensable attribute of being a team player.
 - Lack excessive ego or concerns about status.
 - Do not see themselves greater than they are, but neither do they discount their talents and contributions.
 - "Humility isn't thinking less of yourself, but thinking of yourself less." C.S. Lewis
- 2) <u>Hungry</u>
 - Always looking for more.
 - Never have to be pushed by a manager to work harder because they are selfmotivated and diligent.
- 3) <u>Smart</u>
 - Common sense about people.
 - Ability to be interpersonally appropriate and aware.
 - Deal with people in the most effective way.
 - Emotional intelligence.
