## Why have Eucharistic Adoration?

## 1. If the Mass is the source and summit of the entire Christian life, then why have Eucharistic adoration?

The celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist is, certainly, the "fount and apex" of the entire Christian life. Yet the "spiritual life…is not limited solely to participation in the liturgy". Pope John Paul II calls worship of the Most Holy Eucharist outside Mass "an important daily practice [that] becomes an inexhaustible source of holiness" and a practice "of inestimable value for the life of the Church," so much so that "it is the responsibility of Pastors to encourage, also by their personal witness, the practice of Eucharist adoration, and exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in particular, as well as prayer of adoration before Christ present under the Eucharistic species."
