PRAY, SACRIFICE, INVITE

SUGGESTIONS

- School children, at Our Lady of Lourdes parish in University City, regularly visit the Most Blessed Sacrament on Mondays when they have Exposition. Teachers bring the children as a class throughout the day. This practice begins in kindergarten to promote love of the Eucharist.
- Use language that is difficult to resist when inviting someone to commit to a holy hour. For example: "Can you spend an hour with Jesus?" Rather than "Can you to do a Holy Hour." We all desire to be with Jesus!
- You may wish to have a bulletin board in your chapel with gentle reminders: please do not use cell phones, silence is to be observed, and no food or drink.
- If an adorer is late, ask their Guardian Angel to remind them of their time with Jesus. If it is necessary that you must leave, call the adorer or the captain to inform them of the situation and wait for them to arrive. Staying an extra hour will be the means of many graces for you. If the adorer is late more than once, contact the hourly captain, division leader or parish coordinator. It is a blessing and responsibility to have Eucharistic Adoration.

8. Should priests encourage the faithful to pray before the Blessed Sacrament?

Pope Paul VI urged that the faithful "should not forget about paying a visit during the day to the Most Blessed Sacrament in the very special place of honor where it is reserved in churches in keeping with the liturgical laws, since this is proof of gratitude and a pledge of love and a display of the adoration that is owed to Christ the Lord who is present there." "Pastors should see that churches and public oratories where, according to law, the holy Eucharist is reserved, are open every day at least for some hours, at a convenient time, so that the faithful may easily pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament."
