PRAY, SACRIFICE, INVITE

Are you having difficulty filling the early morning hours? At our recent coordinator workshop one of the coordinators had difficulty with the early morning hours. She asked the early morning adorers if they would be willing to split a holy hour. In place of spending one hour with the Lord they were asked to stay one and a half hours. Example: 12:00 a.m.-1:30 a.m. and 1:30 a.m.-3:00 a.m. 3:00 a.m.-4:30 a.m. 4:30 a.m.-6:00 a.m. the adorers agreed to this schedule and by doing so eliminated several hours of concern.
