



### BISHOP BARRY KNESTOUT USCCB Committee for the Protection of Children and Young People

The Most Reverend Barry C. Knestout is the 13<sup>th</sup> Bishop of the Diocese of Richmond and currently serves as chairman of the Committee for the Protection of Children and Young People for the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). Bishop Knestout holds a BS in Architecture from the University of Maryland as well as a Master of Divinity and Master of Arts in

Moral Theology from Mount Saint Mary's Seminary. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1989, appointed auxiliary bishop for the Archdiocese of Washington in 2008, and installed as bishop of Richmond in 2018.

### SUZANNE HEALY USCCB National Review Board

Suzanne Healy is a retired Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist with nearly 30 years of experience, including ten years as the Victims Assistance Coordinator for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. In addition to her private practice as a therapist, Suzanne has served as a school counselor, bereavement facilitator, member of the Department of Mental Health Faith-Based

Advocacy Council, and a member of the Los Angeles Cyber Crime Task force. She became a member of the USCCB's National Review Board (NRB) in 2017 and has served as Chair for the past three years.

### DEACON BERNIE NOJADERA USCCB Secretariat of Child and Youth Protection

Deacon Bernie Nojadera has served as the Executive Director for the USCCB Secretariat of Child and Youth Protection since 2011. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from St. Joseph College in Mountain View, California; a Master of Social Work degree specializing in health and mental health services from San Jose State University; and a Master of Arts in theology from

PAUL SCHUTZ, PhD
Beyond Bad Apples:

Clericalism, Clergy Perpetrated Sexual Abuse, and Horizons for Healing

Paul Schutz is an Associate Professor of Religious Studies at Santa Clara University. He received his BA in English from Boston College and his MA and PhD in Systematic Theology from Fordham University. His research focuses on the meaning and significance of creation in the Christian tradition, with an emphasis on how scientific research might inform religious

accounts of humanity's relationship with other-than-human creatures. His doctoral dissertation on the theological writings of Jesuit astrophysicist William Stoeger proposes an "ecopolitical" theology oriented toward the flourishing of all creatures. His recent publications apply Stoeger's framework to questions of gender, race, and interreligious dialogue (especially with Buddhism), as well as prayer, liturgy, and ministry. His current book project explores the potential of "flourishing" to serve as a core category for Christian theology and a basis for cultivating a robust praxis of ecological and social justice. Today he will discuss the 2022 report he co-authored with Julie Rubio which explores how a culture of clericalism contributes to the cover-up of sexual abuse by clergy in the Catholic Church.

### REV. JOSEPH KEMPF Don't you dare forgive. Unless...: A Personal Testimony of Courage and Compassion

Fr. Joe Kempf is someone whose love of God shows forth in an enthusiasm for life. Fr. Joe is pastor of Most Sacred Heart Church in Eureka, Missouri, and the founder & president of Gospel Values, a non-profit organization dedicated to proclaiming the beautiful message of Jesus for children of all ages. Fr. Joe is the author of the books No One Cries the Wrong Way and

Don't you dare forgive. Unless..., many videos, and a number of books for children including My Sister is Annoying, Don't Drink the Holy Water, and Sometimes Life Is Just Not Fair. Fr. Joe brings a love of storytelling, a heart for God's people, and a desire to help us remember those things that truly matter.

BRANDON VAIDYANATHAN, PhD
Well-being, Trust, and Policy in a Time of Crisis:
Highlights from the National Study of Catholic Priests

Dr. Brandon Vaidyanathan is Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Sociology and Director of the Institutional Flourishing Lab at The Catholic University

of America. He holds bachelor's and master's degrees in Business Administration from St. Francis Xavier University in Nova Scotia and HEC Montreal, respectively, and a Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of Notre Dame. Dr. Vaidyanathan's research examines the cultural dimensions of religious, commercial, and scientific institutions, and has been published in journals such as Business and Society, Journal of the American Academy of Religion, Social Forces, Social Problems, Sociology of Religion, Journal for the Scientific Study of Religion, Journal for the Theory of Social Behavior, and more. He is author of Mercenaries and Missionaries: Capitalism and Catholicism in the Global South and co-author of Secularity and Science: What Scientists Around the World Really Think About Religion. His research has been funded by grants from the John Templeton Foundation, Templeton Religion Trust, and the Lilly Endowment. He is also Founder of Beauty at Work, a media platform which includes a podcast and YouTube channel that aims to expand our understanding of beauty: what it is, how it works,

and why it matters for the work we do.

Born in Kent, known as the Garden of England, Fiona spent her formative years in several English churches and cathedrals as a Verger. This meant a variety of tasks such as serving at the liturgy and digging graves, sometimes one after the other. Time spent in these venerable spaces led to a desire to pursue formal studies which she did in Canada where it was significantly

cheaper. First, she completed an associate followed by an ecclesiastical degree in theology. She then set her sights on studying canon law. When asked why an Anglican would study Roman Catholic canon law, her reply has always been, "because nobody stopped me." However, she did not realize it would lead to giving talks about it. Before she even had a chance to finish her exams, the Diocese of Jefferson City called looking for a Director of Child and Youth Protection. Since September 2022 she has called the diocese home and continues to serve in that role.

### REV. MATTHEW CRANE, JCL Crime and Punishment: A Journey through Book VI

The Very Reverend Matthew Crane is the Vicar for Canonical Affairs for the Diocese of Saint Cloud. He has a JCL from the Faculty of Canon Law at St. Paul University in Ottawa. Although he has not read every line of merely ecclesiastical law, he has looked at all the pictures.

A Survivor's Perspective:

Rev. Gerard J. McGlone, SJ, PhD, is a senior research fellow at the Berkley Center for Religion, Peace, and World Affairs at Georgetown University. Previously, he was an assistant professor of psychiatry at Georgetown's School of Medicine and, most recently, he served as the associate director for protection of minors for the Conference of Major Superiors of Men.

Fr. McGlone was also the chief psychologist, director of counseling services, and faculty and staff psychologist at the Pontifical North American College in Rome, Italy, and has served as executive director at several major treatment centers for clergy and religious in the United States, including Saint John Vianney Center and Guest House, Inc. In addition, he is a member of the Working Group on Child Rights and Family Values, part of the Culture of Encounter Project at Georgetown.

AMY MAUS, MSW, LCSW Building a Trauma-Informed Church

Amy V. Maus, MSW, LCSW earned her Master of Social Work degree from Washington University in St. Louis and is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker in Missouri and Illinois.

She specializes in services to schools, including work within public, private, and parochial schools, serving students of all ages. A particular joy of hers is providing presentations and

workshops to school-related groups of all sizes. She also leads monthly consultation groups for area school principals and provides psychoeducational testing services for students, focusing on issues related to ADHD, depression and anxiety, behavioral problems, and learning differences. LYNNE LANG, MS
Introduction to Facilitating Listening Circles &
Navigating Difficult Conversations: A Restorative Justice Model

Lynne Lang is the founder and executive director of Restoration Matters, a non-profit with the mission to train teachers, school administration, and staff of community organizations in Restorative Practices. She holds an MS in both Health Management and in Restorative Practices, and has worked in the field of health education, safety, and violence are development since 1994. Her training in Intercultural Competence, Dispute Resolution and

prevention curriculum development since 1994. Her training in Intercultural Competence, Dispute Resolution and Mediation strengthen her skills as a certified trainer with the International Institute for Restorative Practices (IIRP). She is an experienced facilitator in circle processes, and information and formal restorative conferences. Lynne also developed Virtue-Based Restorative Discipline (VBRD), an initiative that integrates restorative practices and time-honored habits for human excellence—the virtues—as well as PRAISES, a Catholic curriculum which links social-emotional competencies with virtues for schools implementing restorative processes using VBRD.

PETER SULLIVAN In Search of the Truth: Understanding Third-Party Investigations

Peter Sullivan is the Founder and President of Sullivan Advisors, LLC. He has over 35 years of leadership experience in federal law enforcement, global security management, and consulting. Mr. Sullivan had a distinguished career with the U.S. Postal Inspection Service and went on to serve as the Director of Global Security for Monsanto Company. He is a

In addition, he has received many honors including U.S. Attorney General Commendations for Support to Victims of Crime and Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee meritorious service. Pete and his team of former military and/or retired law enforcement have significant experience conducting investigations related to allegations of clergy abuse, employee misconduct, child pornography, Title IX sexual misconduct, and code of conduct violations.

### WILLIAM FRANCIS, JR In Search of the Truth: Understanding Third-Party Investigations

William Francis owns WMF Security Consultants LLC and serves as lead investigator under Sullivan Advisors LLC. Mr. Francis has extensive experience conducting and supervising thousands of federal criminal and intelligence investigations as well as investigating allegations of clergy sexual abuse and other misconduct by clerical and lay employees of

religious organizations. He served 32 years with the FBI as a Special Agent and Supervisory Special Agent investigating espionage, counterintelligence, and counterterrorism, and went on to serve as Director of Law Enforcement and Physical Security for the 8<sup>th</sup> District of the Federal Reserve System. In addition, he has earned many recognitions including the U.S. Attorney's Award for outstanding contributions to law enforcement and counterterrorism efforts.

KATHLEEN McCHESNEY, PhD
Confronting the Risk of Sexual Abuse in Catholic Ministries: Effective Strategies for Assessment & Mitigation

Dr. Kathleen McChesney, founder and CEO of Kinsale Management Consulting, has leadership experience within the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, and The Walt Disney Company. She served as the head of FBI field offices in Chicago and Portland, Oregon and within the FBI's International Training Academy

before being appointed as Executive Assistant Director, the Bureau's third-highest position. The USCCB selected her to establish and lead the Office of Child Protection where she developed and administered a national compliance mechanism to ensure that all dioceses complied with civil laws and internal policies relative to the prevention, reporting, and response to the sexual abuse of minors. Dr. McChesney coordinated a major research study of the nature and scope of sexual abuse within the Catholic Church and has published and lectured frequently on the issue of abuse in religious institutions. Kathleen has received several honors including the U.S. President's Award for Distinguished Public Service, the Laetare Medal from the University of Notre Dame, and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Center for Women in Policing. She has also received honorary doctoral degrees from the University of Notre Dame, the Catholic University of America, and Anna Maria College.

### TINA STECK, MBA Parish Audits 101: Building a Culture of Safety and Buy-In

Building upon her experience in non-profit development, consumer product marketing, and automotive manufacturing, Tina serves as Program Manager for the Archdiocese of St. Louis' Office of Child and Youth Protection. In this capacity she and her team oversee the Archdiocese's abuse prevention efforts, providing sexual abuse awareness training and maintaining

Charter and policy compliance for over 56,000 volunteers, employees, and clergy in eastern Missouri. She believes that creating safe environments requires a responsive, knowledgeable, and accountable team at both the parish and archdiocesan levels as well as accommodations and alternatives that remove barriers to success. She holds a BS in Engineering Management from Missouri University of Science & Technology, an MBA from Saint Louis University, and a certificate in High-Performance Leadership from Cornell University.

### JENNIFER PRUSA, CMP Enhancing Survivor Outreach through Journey to Bethany

Jennifer Prusa is the Executive Director of Journey to Bethany, a ministry in the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph with the purpose of serving those harmed by clergy sexual abuse with actions of healing and justice. ### ABOUT THE ARCHDIOCESE History, Cathedrals, and Saints

As Bishop of Louisiana and the Floridas, Bishop Louis DuBourg was the first to make St. Louis his episcopal headquarters in 1817. He brought the Vincentians, the Jesuits, and the Religious of the Sacred Heart to St. Louis, including St. Rose Philippine Duchesne, a treasured name in American heritage and a patron saint of the archdiocese along with St. Louis, King Louis IX of France, and St. Vincent de Paul. In 1826 the Louisiana Territory was split into the dioceses of St. Louis and New Orleans with Bishop Joseph Rosati as the first bishop of St. Louis and administrator of New Orleans. During his tenure, the Basilica of St. Louis, King of France (Old Cathedral) was built in 1831 replacing the original Cathedral Block founded in 1764. In 1847, Bishop Peter Kenrick became the first Archbishop of St. Louis when the diocese became the third metropolitan see in the country. Shortly thereafter, the original diocese was broken up to make—besides St. Louis—the Dioceses of Dubuque, Nashville, Chicago, Milwaukee, and St. Paul with Archbishop Kenrick as the metropolitan. The Diocese of St. Joseph was then established in 1868 followed by the Diocese of Kansas City in 1880. In 1956 these three Missouri dioceses were realigned to create the four current Dioceses of Kansas City-St. Joseph, Jefferson City, and Springfield-Cape Girardeau with the Archdiocese of St. Louis as the metropolitan see. In all, there have been 45 dioceses carved out of the Upper Louisiana Territory which was originally under the St. Louis archbishop.

Three of William Clark's children were baptized in the original log church on the site of the Old Cathedral, in addition to Sacagawea's son, Jean Baptiste Charbonneau. The current Cathedral was completed in 1834 and became the first permanent church in St. Louis as well as the first Cathedral west of the Mississippi River. Construction of the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Louis (New Cathedral) began in 1908 under Archbishop John Glennon with completion of the mosaics in 1988 under Archbishop John May. It was designated as a Cathedral Basilica by St. Pope John Paul II in 1997 and houses the largest collection of mosaics in the Western Hemisphere. We welcome you to St. Louis and to these historic houses of worship.


